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Members and guests are always expected to maintain an acceptable standard of dress on the golf course and in the clubhouse. It is the members responsibility to ensure their guests are aware and adhere to this policy. Club Management and staff have been empowered to interpret and to enforce these dress code regulations. Failure to comply with the dress code regulations may result in you or your guest being asked to change into suitable attire or leave the golf course and Club premises. Management may use discretion when enforcing the dress code with respect to juniors, children and infants.

Acceptable Golf Course or Practice Facility Attire:

Women

- Golf Shirts or blouses are to be collared (traditional, turtleneck, mock neck, blade or dress collar style only) or sleeved (including racerbacks)
 - o If the golf shirt or blouse does not have a collar, it must have a sleeve
- Golf pants, skirts, skorts, capris, golf dresses
 - Minimum length for shorts/skirts/skorts is mid-thigh
 - \circ Ladies yoga pants, leggings, or tights are permitted provided they are golf specific
 - Must be of athletic material (no cotton), solid in color, no mesh inserts and no shorter than below the knee
 - Must be worn with a golf shirt
 - May be worn without a golf shirt but as a layering piece
- Golf specific/athletic-performance hoodies will be permitted as a layering
- Brims on headwear must remain facing forward

Men

- Golf shirts are to be collared (traditional, turtleneck, mock neck, blade or dress collar style only)
 - Must be worn at all times under any permitted layering piece
 - It is recommended that no more than three buttons from the top may be unbuttoned on any buttoned shirt
- Golf specific/athletic-performance hoodies will be permitted as a layering piece
- Golf pants or shorts
 - Minimum length for shorts is mid-thigh
 - Cargo shorts or pants must have a tailored pocket that does NOT exceed the exterior of the material of the leg
 - \circ $\;$ Joggers that are golf-specific may be worn
 - Must be of athletic material (no cotton) and solid in color
- Brims on headwear must remain facing forward

Footwear (All Players)

- Golf shoes with soft spikes or alternative golf specific tread
- Golf specific sandals (with or without socks)
- Athletic rubber soled shoes may be permitted provided clean and in good repair

** Themed events can allow for some exceptions to the dress code upon approval from Head Professional or General Manager.

** Golf Fashions are forever evolving; alternative styles will be permitted at the discretion of Club Management.

** Please note that the Golf Shop may display and sell items which do not meet the golf dress code. Please consult Professional Staff for clarification.

Not Acceptable Golf Course or Practice Facility Attire:

- Denim pants or shorts
- Cargo shorts or pants with a pocket that DO exceed the exterior of the material of the leg.
- All T-shirts, tank or halter tops, spaghetti straps, tops with objectionable print or cartoon caricatures, cut-off shirt or shorts.
- Any vulgar slogans and/or large graphics or advertisements are prohibited
- Athletic jerseys and work-out clothing including, but not limited to, gym/jogging shorts, sweatpants/shorts, track suits, spandex shorts/suits, cycling clothing
- All Apparel that leaves the midriff exposed
- Casual/lounging sweatpants or sweatshirts
- Footwear
 - Any non-golf specific open toed footwear (i.e. flip flops or beach style sandals)
 - Metal or ceramic spiked golf shoes or sandals
 - Any footwear that may cause turf damage in the opinion of management

Acceptable Clubhouse Attire

In the clubhouse, all members and their guests are required to dress tastefully. Clubhouse attire is consistent with required dress code for the golf course, with the following exceptions:

- Denim pants may be worn in all areas of the clubhouse provide they are in good repair (Not ripped or torn)
- Tasteful casual wear is acceptable
- Ladies may wear appropriate attire that is without collars and sleeves (including formal dresses for private functions)
- Formal Headwear in the Dining Room (Private Functions)
- Attire worn for medical or religious reasons is acceptable

Not Acceptable Clubhouse Attire

- Headwear in all indoor dining spaces, including Woodbend Grill (Lounge)
 - While dining on the patio, headwear may be worn, provided that the brims on hats remain facing forward
- Casual/lounging sweatpants or sweatshirts, excluding P Club logoed attire
- Cut-offs, athletic shorts, surfer shorts, tank tops
- Athletic jerseys, team jerseys or any item of clothing with large cartoon graphics or large commercial logos
- Any vulgar slogans and/or large graphics or advertisements are prohibited
